FOR LAY ADVOCATES:

In order for you to practice in our tribal courts, you will need to fill out the attached application, submit the application along with your fee of \$25.00 and proof that you have completed the required paralegal training. You will then be required to meet with the Chief Justice to determine whether you should be allowed to represent litigants. Contact the Clerk of Courts at (715) 779-3348 to schedule an appointment. Do not forget your documentation.
