FOR ATTORNEYS:

In order to practice in our tribal courts, you will need to fill out the attached application, submit the application along with a Certificate of Good Standing from you state bar and a check for \$25.00.

FOR LAY ADVOCATES:

In order for you to practice in our tribal courts, you will need to fill out the attached application, submit the application along with your fee of \$25.00 and proof that you have completed the required paralegal training. You will then be required to meet with the Chief Justice to determine whether you should be allowed to represent litigants.

As a condition of practicing before the Menominee Tribal Courts, attorneys and lay advocates are expected to adhere to all court rules of procedure and any and all laws/ordinances of the Tribe.
